I recommend Jasleen Parihar as a well-rounded clinician, able to conduct detailed psychological assessments and provide treatment services to clients in a variety of venues. I was her Director of Training during her internship at the Centerstone Consortium, regularly interacting with her direct clinical supervisors and sharing her assessment clients.

Jasleen's placement involved conducting comprehensive psychological and psychoeducational evaluations of children in the community that don't often have access to such services. During the course of her year, Jasleen assessed children with trauma, mood disorders, ADHD, learning disorders, anxiety and other disorders; she conducted dozens of assessments during her year with us. Her approach with her clients has always been caring and compassionate, as some of her youngest testing clients had immaturity, attention, developmental and hygiene issues that would test anyone's patience. Jasleen also provided therapy services in school-based counseling settings. She saw children with the same myriad of mental health issues that defined her testing cases.

Jasleen had the unenviable job of being the first intern at a site new to our consortium and to psychological services generally, Jewish Family & Children's Services. In that capacity, she had to face any number of obstacles, frustrations, annoyances and difficulties that are often found in the first year of a program. Within her first months at her internship, she was integral in helping us improve & enhance the quality of our program by alerting us to issues and advocating for needed improvements. We are a much better program because of Jasleen. I trust that she will bring this level of helpfulness into her next placement.

Jasleen also bonded well with her cohort of fellow interns. She was a dynamic force in the intern cohort and also was quite supportive of her peers during times of stress. Jasleen will undoubtedly bring her seasoned assessment skills, empathic clinical manner, helpfulness and good relations with her peers into any position she chooses.
