







Intensive Prevention Services

CORA's Intensive Prevention Services (IPS) program is a specialized after school and home visitation program offered for youth between the ages of 10 and 17 years of age.

Intensive Prevention Services

Philadelphia's IPS program is a partnership between the Department of Human Services and community-based agencies to identify and serve youth between the ages of 10 and 17 years who are at higher risk for truancy/dropout, delinquency and other potential challenges that could impact family.

CORA's IPS program is a specialized after school program that includes case management and resource assistance through home and school visitation. In addition, family and individual counseling services occur in the home or at CORA sites. Parenting support sessions are also available as requested.



IPS Program goals:

- Strengthen resiliency traits and increase personal responsibility
- ♦ Improve life skills, social, and employment competencies
- ♦ Improve youth's school performance, attendance and behavior
- ♦ Improve family relationships
- Prevent illegal behaviors

IPS Services:

- Group counseling
- ♦ Life skills education
- Academic support
- Social-emotional competency building
- ♦ Mentorship
- Recreation
- Work-ready activities
- Community service

IPS Eligibility

Youth must have experienced one or more of the following:

- ♦ A history of running away
- A history of excessive absences from school
- Three or more suspensions or an expulsion within the last year
- An arrest within the past twelve months
