- Virtual Workshop - Developmental Influences on Sensory-Motor Skills, Academics and Mental Health Maude Le Roux, OTR/L, SIPT A Total Approach/Maude Le Roux Academy 10/27/22 – 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Presenter: Maude Le Roux is an OT with 35 + years of experience in multiple methodologies that she has used successfully in pediatric care. She has formed her own work from multiple exposures to other thought leaders and included this is her eclectic approach to development across multiple diagnostic categories. Maude has been training professionals and parents globally in her methods since 2007. She has presented at several international and national conferences and operates a full training schedule year round. She co-authored her book “Our Greatest Allies” with Lauren O’Malley (parent) which reflects the journey of one child as he went through the process at her center. Her unique understanding of sensory-motor and socio-emotional development is rooted in research completed in Sensory Integration as well as Mental Health, to which she adds her own flavor of getting into the mind of a child.

Purpose: This 3-hour workshop will take the participant on a developmental journey that will support clinical reasoning in assessing socio-emotional, relational, and academic behavior. Maude will discuss regulation in its multiple forms as she weaves her way through the different pivotal points that supports the learning behavior we would like to see. She will support the workshop participant from an evidence-based perspective and also be practical in providing tools and tips for a multi-disciplinary audience. It will be a quick tour through some complicated developmental constructs, but her easy way of explaining the complicated intricacies will keep the listener captivated and wanting to learn more. Behavior can be understood in different ways, though for Maude it is about “Chasing the Why”.

This program will benefit Occupational Therapists, Psychologists, Speech Therapists, Educators, Social Workers, Mental Health Counselors, Principals, Teachers, Graduate Students, and other practitioners within mental health and education who provide direct services and/or parent/teacher consultation.

- List a 7-step hierarchy of development that will support clinical reasoning in the team process
- Analyze the co-influence of sensory-motor development with emotional developmental capacities that influences learning behavior
- Use multiple perspectives to determine the impact of development on social-emotional skill as well as academic learning.
